Outside of its core programs and the class service projects, in 2017 Leadership Long Beach continued to find additional ways to have its alumni serve to make the community better. From serving as a guiding force to creating one-day service projects for the MLK, Jr. National Day of Service in Long Beach to having 50+ volunteers pass out water and encouragement to the 15,000 runners, walkers and bikers at the 2017 Jet Blue Long Beach Marathon, alumni of LLB organized, painted, cleaned, planted, carted and more through a variety of activities in all areas of the city. Project activities may have lasted only one hour or they may have continued for several weeks to complete. Nearly all events allowed for LLB alumni to invite their families and friends to join them as well as LLB actively worked with the neighborhoods and local groups whom the service would directly aid.







Leadership Long Beach provides our alumni numerous opportunities to socialize, fellowship and network throughout the year. The LLBI Class of 2017 helped showcase themselves, their projects and the value of our principled leadership program to individuals interested in learning more about Leadership Long Beach through two Leadership Connections events and their Projects Presentation in the spring. The Leadership Long Beach Institute Class of 2018 is comprised of 31 individuals who have committed to be informed about the many aspects of Long Beach, to engage in the city through their sessions and projects, and to connect with LLB alumni and others.



The Institute Class of 2018 began in late August with 31 community leaders ready to learn and engage themselves on the challenges and opportunities for Long Beach. Their 10-month principled leadership program kicked off with 'The Amazing Race,' sponsored by Yellow Cab Long Beach, which had the program participants travel to locales and destinations all-around Long Beach in a scavenger hunt mode; seeing more sites of Long Beach than a long-time resident would. Their first day concluded with the Community Welcome Reception as they were introduced to a crowd of nearly 150. Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia (LLBI '03) spoke to the large audience of LLB alumni, elected officials, and civic leaders in attendance. The reception gave recognition to community/scholarship support from the Long Beach Police Foundation, The Elena Diane Curris (LLBI '09) Memorial Scholarship and the Arts Council for Long Beach.







Through the rest of the year, the LLBI Class of 2018 will continue to learn more about the Long Beach community via their session days gaining information and ideas about the challenges and opportunities facing the city. The **Youth Leadership Long Beach Class of 2018** has 34 high school students who began their 8-month principled leadership training in October to 'discover the leader within.' They represent 12 different high schools and reflect the diversity of the city.

The youth participants have completed their leadership retreat in Big Bear and will now expand upon their leadership potential during the next several months. In addition to their training, they will get a chance to have session days at **City Hall**, the **Port of Long Beach** and the **Boeing Company** and they will help plan and direct **RoboBowl 6**, the LBUSD middle school robotics competition plan for program in the spring.



The leadership retreat weekend in Big Bear provides a unique opportunity for the high school youth to begin their year with an intensive bonding and learning experience that helps them throughout their year together. They are able to participate in group building and teamwork activities without distractions that are normally present.





Coming from the different high schools in Long Beach, the retreat allows the youth to create their own group identity and leave the labels behind in Long Beach. Now with the bonds made on the mountain, the YLLB Class of 2018 is able to work together as a group of committed leaders for the rest of their principled leadership training.

The **Executive Leadership Series Class of 2017** began meeting for six weeks in Spring 2017. These executives from local companies and city agencies found the program insightful and meaningful to assist them with the leadership of their teams and helped them learn about the city.

The **Executive Leadership Series** (ELS), formerly known as Executive Quick Start (EQS) continued for its third consecutive year and increased its programming format to six weeks of leadership learning. Under the direction of current **LLB President-elect Kandice Taylor-Sherwood** (EQS '15), the program has made great strides in addressing the leadership desires and needs of this small cohort. The ELS program provides introductions to key Long Beach leaders and makes use of unique Long Beach locations to provide a well-rounded view of the city.





Discussions, interactions and introductions with key Long Beach leaders is a vital part of the ELS curriculum as the 2017 class had sessions at Long Beach Museum of Art, Rancho Los Alamitos, Rancho Los Cerritos, F&M Bank, the Terrace Theatre, and Keesal, Young & **Logan**. During the six sessions, the class interacted with LB **Community Action Partnership Executive Director Darick** Simpson (LLBI '92), **F&M Bank President** Henry Walker (LLBI '90), LB Conventions & Visitors Bureau **President Steve** Goodling, and Dr. Mike Walter (HBOG),





LEADERSHIP FOUNDATIONS—2017

Begun in January 2016, the Leadership Foundations program held 26 leadership weekends for young adults between the ages of 18 to 26 years old to help provide them guidance and motivation to move their lives in a positive and supportive direction. Following a designation as a 'disconnected young adults' (not in school or a defined career path), Pacific **Gateway Workforce Investment** selected and directed the participants to the program training. Nearly 325 young adults completed in the leadership weekend and gained confidence and ambition to continue their next steps toward their individual new goals.











Led by Leadership Long Beach alumni (more than 80 adult and youth), each Foundations program convened for a fully active 15-hour leadership training weekend. Going from small group work to large group activities, the young adults were able to intermingle with each other while completing interactive tasks to grow their leadership skills. Utilizing the facilities of **Camp Fire USA - Angeles (Long Beach)**, LLB is able to mimic some elements of the traditional Big Bear leadership retreat experience for the young adults to help them gain the trust and bonds necessary to work together. The participants are able to put into practice the core principles of leadership, thereby building their confidence to take the next steps to grow as individuals.

With the Foundations program, Leadership Long Beach is able to impact another segment of the population and provide principled leadership training to this new group of adults. The Foundations participants are able to continue with Pacific Gateway Workforce and channel their newly resolved focus toward employment, career or educational paths. They also gain connections within the LLB network to continue to communicate and motivate them toward their growth.

Through the refinement of the program and the process, plus feedback from survey results, the organization has the ability to create and tailor leadership programs to meet leadership training needs from other organizations, businesses and agencies.




